#### CALIBRATION OF HOSPITAL EQUIPMENT - Suchitra PCA

#### Dear friends,

Whenever we are using any equipment, we have to learn how to operate them. In the same way, it is important to know whether the Equipment is accurate. The company representatives calibrate the equipment and certify the equipment once in 6 months or 1 year (depending on the equipment and manufacturer specifications). We have to calibrate certain Equipment on a daily basis and some equipment once in 3 months. For example: **IOL Master** – daily calibration.

**Perkins tonometer** - 3 monthly calibration. By calibrating regularly, the equipment will give accurate readings. In our hospital, each equipment is being calibrated on a regular basis. Each equipment will have a history card which contains the details of calibration which can be seen by both the operator and the patient.
